TRANSFER OF COUNTY PROPERTY

WHEREAS, Idaho Code 31-808(9) and 67-2322 provides that the Board of County Commissioners may, with or without compensation, grant any real or personal property owned by the county to another political subdivision when it is in the public's best interest, and;

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Office Marine Division was awarded a Waterways Improvement Fund grant by the Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation to repower a Sheriffs vessel with new motors, removing the two current Honda 225 HP motors, and;

WHEREAS, the City of Sandpoint Fire Department operates a 1991 Northwind fire boat with Yamaha marine engines built in 1996 and 1997 that are in poor condition and not suitable for emergency responses. Considering the frequent assistance provided to members of the public on the county's waterways and the vital firefighting capabilities offered by the fire boat, having reliable motors is in the best interest of the public, and;

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Office will no longer have an operational need for the old motors so they would be most beneficial to the public if donated to the Sandpoint Fire Department, thereby allowing them continue their public safety mission as they explore a long-term solution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Commissioners of Bonner County, Idaho authorizes the donation and transfer of the old Honda 225 HP motors to the City of Sandpoint Fire Department without compensation.

The foregoing was duly enacted as a Resolution of the Board of County Commissioners of Bonner County, Idaho, on the 29th day of April, 2025.

SANDPOINT — There was no escaping the Lady Bulldogs on Friday night at War Memorial Field.

Senior Martin Browne scored a career-high four goals. Freshman Kati Argubright netted a career-high four goals of her own.

Sandpoint blanked Mead in WSLA Eastern Division play on senior night for their third win of the season.

We continued possession of the ball tonight and kept possession in our passing, which allowed us to move the ball up the field more effectively," Sandpoint head coach Nancy Doolley said. "I feel like we worked really well together. The whole team was in sync."

Doolley said a few three fourths and potted up a game-high eight goals. Abby Baker scored an extra goal, and Argubright and Doolley both had the charge defensively with three passed turnovers for the Lady Bulldogs, which led to a turnover.

Re: Resolution to Transfer County Property to the Sandpoint Fire Department

The Sheriff's Office Marine Division is currently re-powering a patrol vessel with new motors. Once the existing Honda 225 HP marine motors are removed (serial numbers BAHJ-1400321 and BAGJ1401772), the Marine Division seeks to donate them to the Sandpoint Fire Department for their fire boat. Sandpoint Fire is currently using a twin Yamaha two-stroke engines built in 1996 and 1997, which are in poor condition and not reliable for emergency responses. They would like to mount the engines on their vessel while pursuing a long-term solution. Sandpoint Fire Department is a reliable public safety partner, commonly responding to calls for service to assist the members of the public when the Marine Division does not have on-duty personnel, has an extended response time, or needs additional support. In addition, they provide vital fire suppression capabilities for on-the-water and near-the-water fire incidents, which is a valuable resource to boaters in the county. Public notice was posted on April 19, 2025 as required pursuant to I.C. 31-808(9).
