IDAHO CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

Amendment Number and Question HJR 4

"Shall Section 2, Article III, of the Constitution of the State of Idaho be amended to require that the Senate shall consist of thirty-five members; and shall Section 4, Article III, of the Constitution of the State of Idaho be amended to require that the Legislature shall be apportioned to thirty-five legislative districts?"

Legislative Council's Statement of Meaning, Purpose, and Results to Be Accomplished

The purpose of the proposed amendment is to permanently set the number of senators in the Idaho Legislature, as well as the number of legislative districts in Idaho, at 35. (There are twice as many representatives as senators, which this amendment would not change.) Since 1992, there have been 35 districts and senators, but the Idaho Constitution permits as few as 30 and as many as 35 districts and senators, with the number determined during redistricting (the process of redrawing legislative district boundaries after a United States census). If this amendment is adopted, the number of districts and senators would be fixed at 35 and could not be changed during redistricting.

SHALL THE CITY OF PRIEST RIVER ISSUE AND SELL ITS WATER REVENUE BONDS TO PAY THE COSTS OF IMPROVEMENTS TO THE WATER SYSTEM OF THE CITY IN A PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT TO EXCEED \$2,000,000? THE BONDS SHALL MATURE OVER A PERIOD OF NOT TO EXCEED FORTY (40) YEARS, AND SHALL BE PAYABLE SOLELY FROM THE REVENUES OF THE WATER SYSTEM, ALL AS MORE FULLY PROVIDED IN ORDINANCE NO. 612, ADOPTED ON AUGUST 3, 2020.

The following information is required by Idaho Code Sec. 34-439, as amended:

The Project to be financed by the sale of the proposed water revenue bonds in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$2,000,000, is the acquisition, construction, repair, replacement and installation of certain additions and betterments to the City's water system. The date of the City's special election is November 3, 2020. The existing water revenue indebtedness of the City is \$2,969,992. The maximum interest rate anticipated on the proposed water revenue bonds, based upon current market rates, is 3.5% per annum. The total amount to be repaid over the life of the proposed water revenue bonds, principal and interest, based on the anticipated interest rate, is estimated to be \$3,718,953, consisting of \$2,000,000 in principal and \$1,718,953 in interest. The bonds are revenue bonds, and no property taxes will be levied to repay the bonds.
