Evacuating your private residence is a personal decision.

It is highly recommended that you follow evacuation orders, especially if you live in an undefendable environment or have family members with special needs or medical conditions.

The following are the three levels of evacuation.



At this level, your plan is in place or in development.
Begin to organize your needs to evacuate the area if a higher threat to life comes.



At this level, begin the final preparedness actions before the imminent threat is present.





At this level, you need to evacuate the area immediately due to an imminent life threat.
