Residents wishing to participate in the 'We Control Our Own - No Spray' program must fill out a weed control agreement and post official signs provided by the County. The agreement is in a sub-tab under the 'No Spray Program' tab on the main page. Completed agreements may be scanned and emailed to <u>chase.youngdahl@bonnercountyid.gov</u> or mailed to/dropped off at 1500 Hwy 2, Ste. 101 Sandpoint, ID 83864. Upon receiving the completed agreement, official signs will be mailed to you. If dropping off the agreement at our office, signs will be issued to you at that point. Email & mail is preferred to reduce customer traffic in our office, which is shared by several other departments.

The signs are to be placed in clear view [one sign at the start of the property, and one sign at the end of the property] in the road right-of-way facing the travel lane. It is highly recommended to accomplish this process by **MAY 31**, but the <u>hard</u> <u>deadline</u> is **JUNE 30**. Keep in mind, road right-of-way herbicide treatments usually begin in June so if you wait beyond May 31 your area could be treated with an herbicide application.

If the landowner's alternative weed control methods in the road right-of-way have not been performed by **JULY 15** the agreement is null and void and the roadway is subject to being treated with herbicide by the County if a solution with the Weeds Manager is not agreed upon. For guidance on what needs to be controlled in the County rights-of-way, see the 'Noxious Weeds in Bonner County' list—the tab is on the main page under the WEEDS INFORMATION & RESOURCES heading. Please contact the Weeds Manager if you need weed identification assistance.

No Spray Weed Control Agreements are only valid for <u>one year</u>; they need to be renewed on an annual basis if future participation is desired. However, not every road is sprayed every year—we encourage you to contact the Weeds Manager to find out if your road is scheduled for weed control maintenance for the given year.
