PUBLIC NOTICE

BONNER COUNTY NOXIOUS WEED CONTROL

State Noxious Weed Law: Idaho Statute (Title 22, Chapter 24) expresses that it is the duty & responsibility of all landowners to control noxious weeds on their land and property, in accordance with this chapter and with rules promulgated by the director [of the Idaho State Dept. of Agriculture]--§22-2407. A general notice for control of noxious weeds shall contain the list of [Idaho] noxious weeds and identify those known to be in the county and shall stipulate the obligation to control--§22-2405. This published notice is considered legal & sufficient notice.

The following is the Idaho noxious weed list, subject to the above code(s): *Indicates limited presence in Bonner County, or imminently threatening *^Indicates moderate or widespread presence in Bonner County ***Indicates Statewide Prohibited Genera (all species/subtaxa)

County Right-of-Way Maintenance Treatments: All three road districts could be treated with herbicides on weed infested rights-of-way this field season, May through September, although the east half of the county will be the area of focus for 2024.

To opt out of the right-of-way adjacent to your property being treated, obtain a No Spray Weed Control Agreement from the Bonner County Noxious Weed Control website by May 31. Fill out and submit the agreement in order to be issued "We Control Our Own (No Spray)" signs, free of charge. The signs must be posted by the resident at the property corners facing the travel lane. <u>Property</u> <u>owners are responsible (at their own risk) for the eradication of noxious weeds in those areas</u>. We do not recognize signs that are not obtained from our office and without an associated weed control agreement for the current year. If noxious weed mitigation has not been achieved on or before July 15, the posted area may be subject to Bonner County's operational herbicide treatments. All terrestrial noxious weeds listed above apply to the agreement, as well as the following Bonner County invasive weeds of concern: *Absinth Wormwood, Bull Thistle, Common Tansy, Haresfoot Clover, Kochia, Spotted Cat's Ear and St. Johnswort.*

Public Notices Addition: Property owners who have surface water usage within 50 feet of a county right-of-way must mark the area of intake as a potable water source and notify the Noxious Weeds Dept. prior to May 31. This only applies to open, seepage-type wells, not sealed systems.
