Continuing Education for License Holders

Continuing education is required for individuals who are licensed pesticide applicators in the state of Idaho to ensure they maintain competence and keep current with industry changes. The licensing period in Idaho is 2 years.

9:00-9:50 – What Makes a Noxious Weed “Noxious” & How to Manage Them

This presentation will break down the process for listing noxious weeds, landowner responsibilities pertaining to noxious weeds and how to control them with an integrated approach to management. Herbicide trial data on local invasive weed of concern, Marestalk, will also be shared. **Presenter:** *Chase Youngdahl, Bonner County*

10:00-10:50 – Controlling Tough Invasive Weeds

This presentation will go over Nufarm’s IVM herbicide portfolio, highlighting new technologies, including their Xtra High Load formulations. Field trials showcasing various herbicide mixes targeting resistant weeds like Kochia & Equisetum will be shared. **Presenter:** *Jon Storr, Nufarm*

11:00-11:50 – No Legs but They Still Move—the Long & Short of Weed Movement

My neighbor’s weeds keep blowing onto my property. But are they? This presentation will break down weed movement/seed dispersal, focusing on Hawkweeds & Spotted Knapweed and their botanical differences with how it relates to spread. Effective herbicides will be shared, and how the application strategies for controlling Hawkweed & Knapweed differ. Movement along waterways will also be touched on, with Meadow Foxtail & Reed Canarygrass being showcased. Herbicide control on these will also be covered. **Presenter:** *Dr. Tim Prather, University of Idaho*
